

# Remembering Herne Hill 1914-18



#### How old were they?

The average age of a soldier at death was early 20s. The minimum age to fight abroad was 19, but many lied about their age.



one boy, Harold Fowler, lost his life at 16

#### Where did they live?

You can search our website to find that out. From names so far researched. 10 percent lived in Railton and Mayall Roads. In these roads two families often shared a single house.

How many residents died?

Herne Hill lost over 500 - we are still finding more. In fact the figure may be as high as 700. The total for London has been estimated at 100,000 (plus 230,000 wounded).

#### Where did they die?

Mostly in France and Belgium - but also in Afghanistan, Egypt, Greece, India, Iraq, Palestine, Italy, Malta, Russia, Syria, Tanzania, Turkey, the UK and on the seas.

#### Among the casualties were

Fred Lucas was a Staff Serjeant in the Royal Garrison Artillery when he was killed at the Somme in July 1916. He left a widow and five little children at 45 Kemerton Road.

Louisa Tearle, from 88 Railton Road, was a stewardess on the RMS Falaba when it was torpedoed and sunk by U-28 in March 1915. Over 100 passengers and crew, including Louisa, were killed.

> The Armistice of 1918 was not really the end of the war, which continued to claim lives. Lance Corporal Ronald Easterbrook of Milton Road served in Mesopotamia (today, Iraq) and died on board ship while returning to England via India in April 1919.

#### How will we remember them?

St Paul's church honours the 107 men who lost their lives. There were 99 names on the memorial at St Saviour's. The memorial on the Peabody Estate commemorates 35 residents. The former St Jude's church on Dulwich Road once had a memorial with 75 names - now lost. There are other memorials... and many unrecorded casualties.
